

GIVE A SECOND CHANCE



LAST YEAR YOUR DONATIONS ALLOWED US TO

- Assist 1,354 adults and children impacted by incarceration.
- Prepare 350 clients with criminal records for a successful job search.
- Support 125 + families with incarcerated loved ones.
- Provide in school support groups to 173 kids with incarcerated parents.
- House and provide programming to 51 incarcerated women during their transition back to the community.
- Provide trauma and substance use support groups to 83 people with criminal records.
- Lower the chance of recidivism for all our reentry clients. Our program recidivism rates were 28% and below.

Current Needs

In order to continue reducing recidivism, lessening burdens on families, and supporting returning community members, we need to raise **\$30,000** by December 31st. With these funds we can:

SUPPORT FAMILIES IMPACTED BY INCARCERATION

- ◈ Provide meals and materials for Third Tuesday Family Support Nights
- ◈ More field trips and enrichment opportunities for children with incarcerated parents
- ◈ Ongoing costs associated with running in-school support groups

Total Needed: \$5,000

HELP WOMEN IN TRANSITION

- ◈ Cover tuition, fees, and materials for incarcerated women choosing to pursue a college education
- ◈ Updates to improve safety and wear and tear at the Women's Facility, now more than 10 years old.
- ◈ Support the purchase of a new van to transport women to important appointments, meetings, home leave, and other facilities

Total Needed: \$15,000

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WITH TRANSITION

- ◈ Help clients cover transitional housing costs.
- ◈ Provide financial assistance to clients facing sudden transportation issues
- ◈ Provide interim assistance to clients needing temporary help affording medications, work uniforms, etc.

Total Needed: \$10,000
